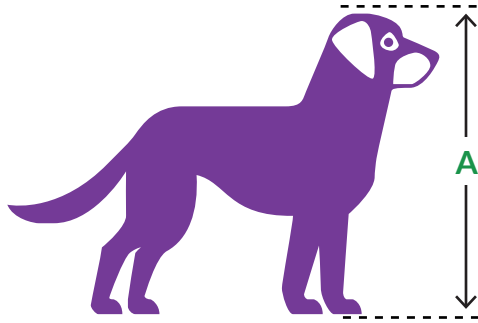
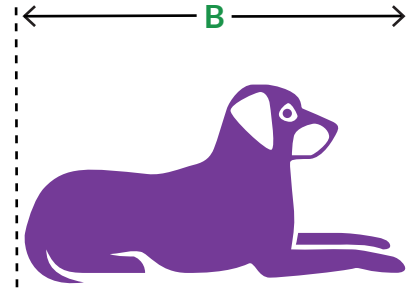




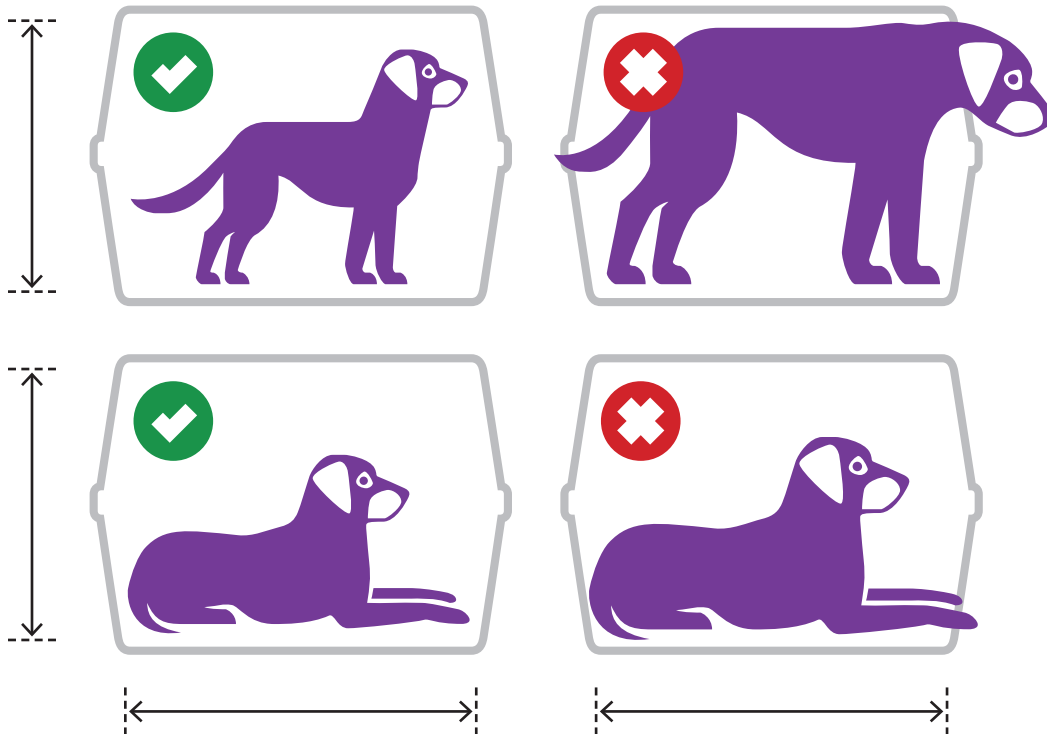
## Measuring Your Dog For a Travel Kennel



**Measurement A:** When your pet is standing, measure them from the floor to the top of their head. For dogs with upright ears, measure to the the ear tips if they are higher than the top of the head.



**Measurement B:** When your pet is lying down as shown above, measure from their rear to the farthest point of their front paw.



**Each crate must:**

**1)** Be large enough for your pet to move freely and stand with their head erect, to turn around and to lie down in a normal position.

**2)** Be tall enough to provide enough room for your pet to stand and sit without their head or ear tips (whichever is higher) touching the top.

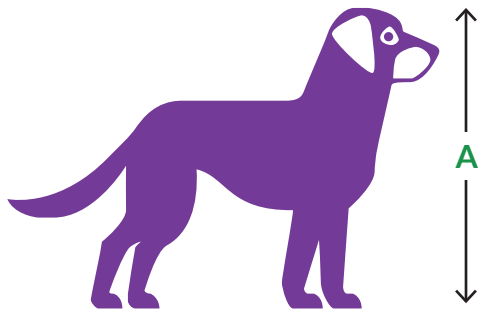

# Measuring Your Dog For a Travel Kennel

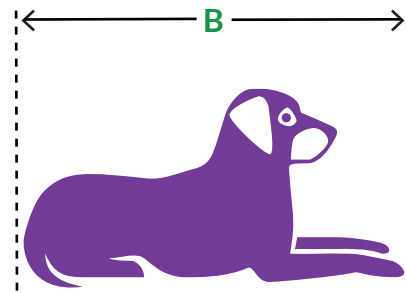
## You will need:

1. Measuring tape
2. Sheet of paper
3. Pencil
4. Painter's tape or masking tape



## Measurement A:

1. Tape a piece of blank paper to the refrigerator or wall.
2. Stand your dog against the wall or fridge.
3. Make sure your dog's posture is straight and that the neck is up in its natural upright position.
4. Use a pencil to make a mark on the wall to indicate the highest point of your pet's head or ears (if your pet has pointy ears mark at the top of the ears).
5. Measure the distance from the floor to the mark you just made and write down this measurement.



## Measurement B:

1. Using some painters tape, have your dog down in a sternal position, place a piece of tape on the ground at the end of their front paw and at the base of the tail (rump).
2. Measure the distance between the two pieces of tape from the front paw mark to the rear end mark.
3. Write down this measurement.

## Tip:

For both measurements, it's easier to measure once the dog has moved. In our experience, dogs either want to play with the tape measure or are suspicious of it. You will likely find it's less hassle for you if the dog is not in the middle things!

## Measuring Your Cat:

Travel kennels for cats are usually based on the cat's weight and breed. If you'd like to send us your cat's measurements they will help; but most cats tell us they would rather not be measured.
